ISS partnering with IP3 to offer faculty, students and corporations scholarship dollars.

"Las Vegas is a strategic security market," Kousky says, "because of the many security issues the gaming industry faces, for instance data protection and legislative compliance. In addition, the large public events have made the entire community aware of the vital importance of a robust security infrastructure." Las Vegas is one of 20 cities IP3 will visit during its 2004 national workshop tour.
